- Accessible venues and hotel properties
- Experience in sport event management
- Support of the local community
- A strong local organizing committee (LOC) with the ability to generate local event sponsorships and resources
- Sophisticated venues and hotel properties
- Affordability of the event for participants

NATIONALS CYCLES & BID DEADLINES

The Move United Nationals have moved to a 2-year cycle for the host city and LOC. It is the intention of the organization to move the event around the country every 2 years.

Bids for 2025-2026 and 2027-2028 will be accepted until September 15, 2023. If Move United receives a strong bid prior to the deadline, we reserve the right to move forward awarding the bid at an earlier date.

ABOUT MOVE UNITED

Move United is the national leader in community adaptive sports, empowering 100,000 youth and adults with disabilities each year to live to their fullest potential. Move United's 200 member organizations in 43 states are united by a single mission: ensuring everyone, regardless of ability, experiences the life-changing power of sport and is fully included in their community.

MOVE UNITED NATIONALS OVERVIEW

Beginning in 2023, Move United will bring together two championship events from its past. Celebrating the end of the summer sport season, the Move United Nationals will encompass both an adult and youth component. The weeklong event is for youth, adult, and masters athletes with a physical, visual, and/or intellectual impairment. Athletes must be classifiable under the International Paralympic Committee's (IPC) classification code and must meet qualifying standards according to classification and age divisions in order to be eligible to compete. The sports contested at the event include archery, paratriathlon, para powerlifting, shooting, swimming, and track and field. International athletes and/or teams are welcome with a dual medal system utilized.

The event serves as a platform to promote physical activity and independence for individuals with a disability and provides a national showcase for their abilities through sport. Athletes often experience heightened socialization, selfesteem, and confidence and develop self-discipline and focus while training for and participating in the event. Additionally, Nationals serves as a pipeline to international competition and the Paralympic Games.
