




- Total events: Increased from 26 to 34

2025 ACTION ITEMS

The Hartford Nationals

- Establish MOU with each National Governing Body with a sport on program
- Engage local and national funders to include long-standing partner, The Hartford
- Develop and provide training and education to the Grand Rapids based Local Organizing Committee led by West Michigan Sports Commission and Mary Free Bed Hospital
- Engage athletes, coaches, volunteers, and officials from throughout the state of Michigan at the event
- Continue to focus on creating an accessible, affordable, and diverse environment for attendees
- Manage over 100 Move United staff, local organizing committee members, and national support team members & continue to define roles
- Enhance the behind-the-scenes Competition Management System for timely and accurate results and awards
- Create a schedule that maximizes resources and opportunities for the athletes and the support team
- Create and enhance education and communication tools to provide the most clear and accurate information to the community

Sanctioned Competitions

- Expand outreach to athletes in Alaska, Montana, New Hampshire, New Mexico, and Wyoming
- Outreach to gap areas on the map to encourage the creation of new event and/or addition of existing event to the network
- Simplify Demographic Reporting Process for Event Directors to facilitate obtaining data
- Cultivate Next Generation Program to bring new faces and energy to the movement
