Clinic Topic: Owning Fundamental Mechanics in Peer-to-Peer Movement Analysis Using Adaptive Equipment - Geoff Krill geoff@geoffkrill.com

1. Learn to use Movement Analysis process of Observe, Evaluate, Prescribe
 - A. What to look for bottom up or top down (personal Preference)
 - B. Observe the group of peers and evaluate what to coach towards
 - C. Prescribe what will have the most skill development for the group
2. Coach peers towards desired skill acquisition
 - A. Student centered is the goal
 - B. Teach to the individual in front of you
 - C. Provide individualized feedback and coaching
3. Learn what real time peer-to-peer coaching is
 - A. Teach to what is in front of you at the moment
 - B. What are their needs in the moment for those you are coaching, not preconceived assumptions
 - C. Remember everyone in the group doesn't need the same feedback
4. Acquire new skills and approaches to group management
 - A. It is ok to have different coaching tasks for peers based upon their own skill acquisition
 - B. It is ok to use of different tasks and coaching as the group develops at different speeds
 - C. Not everyone needs to finish the lesson with an equal level of accomplishment
5. Learn to actively coach to the individual needs of the peers within the group
 - A. Coach your peers as though they each have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP)
 - B. The lesson is about the individual and their journey which always progresses at different rates
