The 2025 event, scheduled for July 11-17 in Grand Rapids, MI, will be the 68th year of competition. With hundreds of athletes with disabilities and coaches participating, the weeklong event includes competitions, clinics, education and social opportunities. The sports contested include archery, boccia, para powerlifting, paratriathlon, shooting, swimming, track and field and wheelchair tennis. ABOUT THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

For the 2025 & 2026 The Hartford Nationals, Grand Rapids, Michigan has been selected as hosts with the West Michigan Sports Commission and Mary Free Bed Wheelchair & Adaptive Sports making up the local organizing committee.

The West Michigan Sports Commission is no stranger to Olympic-style sporting events as they own and operate the Meijer State Games of Michigan and have hosted the USA Masters Games as well as re-created the Transplant Games of America after its predecessor folded the US Transplant Games. They are well versed in how to manage the events, people and logistics of an event, in partnership with Move United, like The Hartford Nationals.

Mary Free Bed Wheelchair & Adaptive Sports is a top program in the country that hosts adaptive sports clinics, manages 11 sports teams and hosts their own tournaments. Part of the Move United member network, their expertise in adaptive sports is top notch and they are a perfect partner on the LOC for hosting The Hartford Nationals.

TALKING POINTS

What Does Para or Adaptive Sport Mean?

- Adapted is having been changed through specialized equipment, different rules, or other changes to allow participation
- Adapted equipment are tools that have been changed to help people with disabilities; tools could be sport specific or for everyday life
- Adapted sports are competitive or recreational sports for people with disabilities
- Adapted physical education is physical education that has been modified for an individual with a disability
- The word "Paralympic" derives from the Greek preposition "para" (beside or alongside) and the word "Olympic". Its meaning is that Paralympics are the parallel Games to the Olympics and illustrates how the two movements exist side-by-side. The Hartford Nationals is a steppingstone for athletes along the athlete pipeline, many of whom become Paralympians.

2025 The Hartford Nationals Basics:

- Move United, the national leader in community-based sports and recreation for individuals with disabilities, will have its 2025 The Hartford Nationals in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The event, scheduled for July 11-17, will mark the 68th year of Nationals.
- The Hartford Nationals conducted by Move United is the largest longest-running national championship event for athletes with a physical, visual, and/or intellectual disability.
- The national competition for adult athletes began in 1957 and continued through 1995. Youth athletes started competing in 1984, and those two events merged in 2024.

- The Hartford Nationals serves as a pipeline to international competition and the Paralympic Games. In fact, nearly 62% of the Paralympians representing the United States at the 2024 Paralympics in Paris participated this event or another Move United program.
- More than 400 athletes with disabilities and coaches are expected to participate in the major event—jam-packed with competitions, clinics, education, and social opportunities. Of course, the weeklong event features a wide array of sports, including:
 - Archery
 - Boccia * The Hartford Nationals debut
 - Para powerlifting
 - o Paratriathlon
 - Shooting
 - Swimming
 - Track and field
 - Wheelchair tennis through the Wheelchair and Para-Standing Tennis Tournament through Mary Free Bed Wheelchair and Adaptive Sports
- 397 athletes from 34 states were at the 2024 event. We welcome new and returning athletes with a goal of a 10% participation increase annually.
- <u>National classification</u> will be offered in archery, swimming and track and field.
- Archery is sanctioned by USA Archery, paratriathlon is sanctioned by USA Triathlon, swimming is observed by USA Swimming, Track & Field is World Para Approved and USATF sanctioned, and wheelchair tennis is sanctioned by USTA.
- New to The Hartford Nationals competition lineup for the first time ever is the addition of the sport of boccia
- A sample of clinics and education session opportunities, Paralympians onsite and fun to be had:

 - Book signing with Paralympian Tatyana McFadden

 - Sport Livestreaming with Paralympian Rudy Garcia-Tolson at swimming, Amanda McGrory during Sunday's track session, Bobby Body at para powerlifting and others.
 - Get Down with Sitting Volleyball with USA Volleyball's Elliott Blake, Manager of Sitting Volleyball
 - o Adaptive Judo & Self Defense with Olympian Nina Cutro Kelly
 - Sport chair giveaway from Eagle Sportschairs
 - SNS Junior Athlete of the Year award announced
 - Induction of two individuals into the Adaptive Sports Hall of Fame and other awards presented by Move United
 - Hanger's mental toughness clinic
 - Para Pickleball and Wheelchair Softball and Tennis from our host member organization, Mary Free Bed Wheelchair & Adaptive Sports
 - Education sessions on shoulder health & injury prevention in adaptive sports and social security and vocational rehabilitation.

Host and Venue Information:

- The local organizing committee that will host the 2025 (& 26) event is led by the West Michigan Sports Commission and includes Mary Free Bed Wheelchair & Adaptive Sports.
- This will be the second time the state of Michigan has hosted the event as Saginaw was the host city in 2011.

Eligibility and Qualifying:

- Through the Move United Member network, over 35 sanctioned competitions occur across the United States serving as qualifiers leading up to Nationals. Athletes must qualify to compete through a <u>Move United Sanctioned Competition</u>, a National Governing Body or High School Athletic Association sanctioned event, or another event approved by Move United.
- Eligible athletes include youth and adults with a physical, visual and/or intellectual disability who are classifiable under the International Paralympic Committee's classification system.
- The event often attracts athletes with an amputation, cerebral palsy, congenital abnormalities, dwarfism, limb deficiencies, spina bifida, a spinal cord injury, visual impairment, and/or various other disabilities ages 6 through adulthood.
